

AP (Advanced Placement) is a nationally-recognized and administered college-level examination program offered by the College Board (which also administers the CLEP and SAT Exam programs). AP exams are offered in conjunction with AP-level courses taught at high schools across the country for high school-level students. Many AP examinations cover material taught in similar courses offered at Central College; other AP examinations cover material that is not directly equivalent to currently-offered Central courses, but that is deemed by Central to be the kind of material covered in courses offered at other colleges and universities whose curricula and academic requirements are similar to Central's and, therefore, worthy of Central College transfer credit.

Students must earn a minimum score of 3 (out of 5) on an AP exam to be granted Central College academic credit. Specific AP-Central College credit and course equivalencies are detailed in the table below. *Important: For Central College credit to be granted for an AP exam, students must request that AP/The College Board send directly to Central College's Academic Records & Registration office an official AP exam transcript.*
