Founded in 1853, Central College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college of the Reformed Church in America. Located 40 miles southeast of Des Moines, Central offers its 1,635 students learning opportunities not only on the Pella campus, but on branch campuses in London and Colchester, England; Merida, Yucatan, Mexico; Leiden, the Netherlands; and Carmarthen, Wales; and at study centers in Granada, Spain; Paris, France; and Vienna, Austria.

Central is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III, and the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Men compete in baseball, football, basketball, tennis, golf, wrestling, soccer, track and cross country while women compete in tennis, golf, track, softball, volleyball, cross country, soccer and basketball. Rugby is offered at the club level.

The Kuyper Athletics Complex

The Kuyper Athletics Complex is located at the corner of Independence Street and West Fifth Street in southwest Pella. The complex includes P.H. Kuyper Gymnasium (1970), H.S. Kuyper Fieldhouse (1987), A.N. Kuyper Field (1977), the baseball and softball fields (1978), Ryerson Golf Driving Range (2002), tennis courts (1992), soccer field (2005) and the Ron Schipper Fitness Center (1999). The complex also includes practice and intramural softball diamonds and football fields. Golf meets are held at the Bos Landen Golf Resort, two miles southwest of the campus on Highway T-15.

Jeff McMartin

Head coach

After piloting his alma mater to an NCAA Division III playoff berth and a share of the Iowa Conference title in 2005, Jeff McMartin is in his third season as head football coach at Central College.

McMartin, the 2005 conference coach of the year, has compiled a 15-6 record in his first two seasons, including a 9-1 regular-season mark in 2005. He's been a part of one of the nation's most tradition-rich college football programs as a player and student assistant and now head coach. The 2005 conference crown was Central's 27th and the school's 17 NCAA Division III playoff berths matches the most in the nation. Central hasn't had a losing football season since 1960.

Named as one of 10 "hot" coaches and "primed for success" in the NCAA Division III by American Football Monthly in 2005, McMartin also gained extensive coaching experience at other schools for 13 years, coaching nearly every position.

Prior to returning to Central, McMartin was the offensive coordinator and offensive line coach at DePauw University (Ind.). During his four years there, DePauw broke several school offensive records.

From 1995-2000, he served as offensive line coach at Beloit College (Wis.) where he also worked with special teams. From 1994-95 he was the defensive line coach at the University of Rochester (N.Y.) and was defensive line coach at Illinois Wesleyan University from 1992-94. He was a graduate assistant at Wake Forest from 1990-92.

McMartin graduated from Central in 1990 with a bachelor's of arts degree in physical education. He earned his master's degree in liberal studies from Wake Forest University (N.C.) in 1992.

While at Central, McMartin served as a student coach under hall of fame coach Ron Schipper for two seasons after a career-ending injury. He was also a student coach at Oskaloosa High School in 1987.

McMartin is also a veteran track and field coach. He was head men's and women's coach at Beloit from 1995-2000 and interim head coach at Illinois Wesleyan in 1994. McMartin was also an assistant at De Pauw from 2000-03, at Rochester from 1994-95 and at Illinois Wesleyan in 1994.

McMartin's wife Laurie is also a 1990 graduate of Central and they have two children.

"Jeff McMartin strikes me as exactly what our football program needs now and possibly for the next 40 or so years," said Central president David Roe at the time of McMartin's hiring in 2004. "Not only does he bring a passion for winning football and in-depth knowledge and experience with all aspects of the game, but he is dedicated to helping students build dreams and become successful in life. He models the values, character and qualities that foster accomplishment. In short he is a very worthy successor to the mantle passed on by coaches Ron Schipper and Rich Kacmarynski."

"This school means everything to us," McMartin said. "I'd like to be a part of the continued success of the Central College football program."

Assistants

Jeff Bollard - tight ends

Jeff Bollard is in his 21st season as an assistant football coach at Central and is in his second year working with the tight ends. A native of Pocahontas and a 1989 Central graduate, Bollard also coordinates the computerized breakdowns of game videos. Bollard is the founder of ICE Technologies in Pella and now works as an independent programmer. He is also a private flight instructor. Bollard and his wife Betty have two children.

Don De Waard, defensive coordinator/linebackers

Don De Waard is in his 24th year as linebacker coach and also serves as defensive coordinator. He is a 1982 Central graduate and former Dutchman player.

In 2000, the American Football Coaches Association named De Waard the Div. III Assistant Coach of the Year. He was honored at the AFCA convention in Atlanta, Ga. in January, 2001.

A native of Kanawha, he is a certified public accountant and also serves as president of the Molengracht, a \$15-million downtown development project in Pella. De Waard and his wife Jean have four children.

Reid Evans, offensive line

Reid Evans is in his sixth season as an assistant coach and his second year as a full-time member of the Central staff, working with the offensive line. A 2001 Central graduate, Evans was a four-time varsity letterwinner and a two-time first-team all-Iowa Conference center for the Dutch. The Newton, Iowa native was a third-team pick for the 2000 Hewlett-Packard all-America team and participated with a team of Div. III all-stars in the 2000 Aztec Bowl in Mexico.

Evans was also a four-time track and field letterwinner, winning conference titles in the shot put and discus and qualifying for the NCAA Div. III national meet in those events.

Following graduation, Evans played and coached football for the Franken Timberwolves in Nuremburg, Germany in 2001. A former co-owner and vice-president of DSI Data Services, Evans also serves in Central's marketing and media relations office as Marketing Web Programmer.

Eric Jones, defensive line

Eric Jones is in his ninth season on the Central staff, returning after a three-year absence. Jones previously coached the offensive line and tight ends and also spent a season as the team's offensive coordinator. A 1987 Central graduate, Jones was an offensive guard for the Dutch. He received his master's degree in counseling education from Iowa State University.

Jones taught and coached in Shelbina, Mo. and was an at-risk coordinator and assistant coach at Pella High School. He previously served as assistant director of admission at Central while also working with the college's retention program

and in several capacities in the student life office. In 2002, Jonoes received a Central Presidential Service Standards Award for his work at the College.

From 2003-06 Jones spent three years as dean of students at Waukee High School before returning to Central as a counselor in the student life office.

Matt Paulsen, defensive backs

Matt Paulsen is in his ninth season as an assistant coach, working with the defensive secondary. A 1997 Central graduate, Paulsen was an all-American defensive back for the Dutch and a four-time letterwinner. He was a three-time all-Iowa Conference selection, the 1997 team MVP, and holds the school career interceptions record (18). He spent the summer of 1999 playing for a club team in Germany. A Waverly-Shell Rock High School graduate, Paulsen was raised on a farm near Plainfield, Iowa and is a two-time selection to the All-American Farm team named by Successful Farming magazine. He is employed by Heritage Lace, Inc.

Dr. David Roe, kicking coach

Dr. David Roe, Central College president, is in his ninth season as kicking coach for the Dutch football squad.

A retired Air Force brigadier general and a former financial services company executive, Roe became Central's president in 1998.

Roe is a lifelong athlete, lettering in football, swimming and track in high school. He is a graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy where he earned two letters in soccer and was team MVP as a junior and team captain as a senior.

Following graduation he attended Oxford College in England as a Rhodes Scholar and competed in rugby, soccer, rowing and cricket. Roe served as an officer-representative for the Air Force Academy's varsity soccer team, and played and coached amateur soccer most of his adult life. He has coached youth soccer and served as a football kicking coach for his son while stationed in Europe, helping him win "all-Europe" honors in a European amateur league. Roe also competed in the Dallas Marathon at the age of 50 in 1990.

While studying at Oxford, Roe completed the Bachelor of Medicine examination. He received the M.S. and Ph.D. degrees in physiology from the University of Illinois and is the author of numerous published articles on human physiology and national military strategy.

Jeff Sanger, stingers

Jeff Sanger is in his fourth season as an assistant coach at Central, working with the stinger position on defense.

Sanger, a 2001 Central graduate, was a two-time all-America selection, a two-time Schilder team MVP award winner and a three-time all-Iowa Conference pick as a linebacker. He also was chosen as a Central team co-captain for two seasons. The Britt, Iowa native set the school freshman-season tackles record in 1997 with 111 and racked up 375 stops in his career.

Sanger also serves as an admission office representative at Central.

Kevin Sanger, receivers-special teams

Kevin Sanger is in his 13th season as assistant coach and his first year working with receivers after 12 years as defensive line coach.

He also serves as head men's and women's track and field coach, and was named the Iowa Conference men's coach of the year in 1997, 1998, 2000, 2003 and 2004. He was tabbed the NCAA Div. III indoor regional coach of the year in 1999 and won outdoor honors in 2004. A four-year letterwinner in both track and football at Central, Sanger graduated in 1993. He received a master's degree from Iowa State University.

In 2001, Sanger received a Central Presidential Service Standards Award for his work at the college.

Jerry Southmayd, running backs

High school hall of famer Jerry Southmayd is entering his fifth season as assistant coach, working with the tight ends after two seasons as quarterbacks coach.

Southmayd served as head football coach at Wapsie Valley High School from 1969-2001, Southmayd posted a 241-83 record including 18 playoff appearances and three state titles in 1986, 1987, and 1997. He was enshrined in the Iowa Football Coaches Association's hall of fame in 1990 and served as a Shrine Bowl all-star game coach in 1992. He was named the Des Moines Register's state coach of the year in 1987 and was the IFCA Class IA coach of the year in 1997. Southmayd was also a math instructor at Wapsie Valley and was the school's athletic director for two years. He served as head golf coach for 10 years, and was an assistant basketball and wrestling coach.

He served on the IFCA's board of directors for six years and chaired the group's ethics committee for six years.

A graduate of Yankton College (S.D.), Southmayd received a master's degree in physical education from the University

of South Dakota and a secondary administration endorsement from the University of Northern Iowa.

A high school baseball umpire, Southmayd has been a counselor and activities director for the American Legion's Boys' State program for 28 years.

Travis Sterling, player development

Travis Sterling is entering his ninth season on the Central football staff and his third year as the player development assistant, coordinating the team's leadership program.

For six seasons, Sterling assisted with the team's strength and conditioning program. A 1993 Central graduate, Sterling was a first-team all-Iowa Conference offensive guard and was a two-time CoSIDA academic all-district selection.

The Pekin, Iowa native spent a year in graduate school at Iowa State University studying biomechanics before completing requirements for a master's degree in physical therapy at the University of Iowa.

A certified strength and conditioning specialist, Sterling heads the orthopaedic and sports physical therapy program at Pella Health and Fitness. He previously supervised a clinical sports medicine program in the physical therapy department at a local hospital.

In 2004, Sterling became one of just 30 Board-Certified Orthopaedic Clinical Specialists in Iowa and was honored for this achievement in 2005 at the American Physical Therapy Association Combined Sections meeting in New Orleans, La.

Outlook

The Central College football program is back on familiar footing as an Iowa Conference and NCAA Division III contender after just two seasons at the helm for coach Jeff Martin, but he and his players are far from satisfied.

A surprising 9-2 run that produced a share of Central's 27th Iowa Conference title and a record 17th NCAA Division III playoff trip in 2005 has quickly heightened expectations as McMartin's turnaround gathers even more steam.

It's not as though a brick-by-brick rebuilding effort was required, but following 42 consecutive winning seasons, an uncharacteristic 5-5 campaign in 2003 was cause for concern among the Dutch faithful. McMartin steadied the ship with a 6-4 effort in 2004, but his second club was still picked for no better than fifth place as he headed into last season.

Now Central has suddenly been slapped with a favorite's tag for 2006 as 14 starters return, including junior running back Vance Schuring, the Iowa Conference MVP.

Yet lost in the championship afterglow is the realization that a 9-1 regular season was painfully close to a 5-5 effort or worse. Central's first two victories were decided on the game's final play and the squad trailed by 11 points in the second half of two other wins. The Dutch won three games in which an opposing running back gained 199 yards or more and Central was outgained for the season by an average of 349.6 yards to 333.8. McMartin needs no reminder.

"The luxury we have is that we have a lot of guys back," he said. "The challenge we have is that we've got to improve. We want to take another step and we're very hungry, but we still have a lot of work to do. Last year wasn't a perfect season."

Whether others see Central as a favorite matters less to McMartin than his own team's mindset.

"Outwardly people probably see us a little differently," he said. "But inwardly, we have to approach each game very similarly to the way we did last year. We're in a conference with a lot of very talented teams. For us to win, we have to play as a team. We have to be sharp mentally and physically on every play and we've got to stay healthy. Our formula hasn't changed. We have to give everything we have and play hard. We have to excel on special teams, play great defense and take care of the football. And when we get in the red zone, we've got to score. Those are staples of what we do."

Special teams

Giving lip service to the value of special teams is a rite of summer for coaches providing preseason assessments for the media. But rarely has a Central team's success been tied so closely to special teams play as the 2005 squad's. The key cogs in that unit all return for 2006 and it will be an area of emphasis for McMartin again.

"Special teams as a whole helped us have a great season," he said. "For us to be competitive in our league, we really need to make it a strength again. We've got some talented people but we've really got to work at it."

The Dutch got huge momentum swings with eight blocked kicks and punts, while excelling at their own kicking games.

Punter Brant VerMeer had never even tried the position prior to late 2004. He returns for his senior season as a first-team all-Iowa Conference pick, leading the league with a 39.9-yard average, landing 24 of his 65 boots inside the opponent's 20-yard line.

"Brant's a great directional kicker but he's also got a great leg," McMartin said. "He won the position last year, then took off and ran with it. He's a weapon."

Senior placekicker Brandon O'Neill hit 34 of 38 extra points and was 6-for-10 on field goals with a long of 40 yards.

"I thought Brandon made a huge jump over his sophomore year," McMartin said. "He improved on extra points and made a big 40-yard field goal for us at Loras in a driving rain. And on kick-offs he's got a real good leg. I'm really proud of the improvement he's made."

Senior Bobby Wheat and David Cain provide backup help as a kicker and punter. Sophomore Adam Squires is also available as a punter after gaining a year of experience with the JV. McMartin said the Dutch have some quality punters and kickers in the new freshman class as well.

Senior Brett Doud was a first-team all-conference pick as a punt and kick returner. He averaged 11.3 yards on 25

punt returns and 31.2 yards on nine kick returns, including an 80-yarder for a touchdown.

"Brett had a breakout season," McMartin said. "Coach (Kevin) Sanger is our special teams coordinator and he and our staff do a great job of finding ways to open up the returns. Brett (Doud) really took advantage of those opportunities."

Junior Cody Huisman is back after averaging 20.8 yards on 18 kick returns. The Dutch might also utilize junior Guy Dierikx and sophomore Cam Waugh.

Quarterback

Junior Tim Connell enters his second year as the starting quarterback after making steady progress last season. He completed 122 of 243 passes (.502) for 1,542 yards, an average of 140.5 yards per game. He threw 13 interceptions with 10 TDs. Connell was also Central's second-leading rusher with 43.2 yards per game, picking up 475 yards and five scores on 116 carries.

"Tim looks to be a guy who will continue to improve," McMartin said. "He's gotten more comfortable. He's very competitive and has fun playing."

Last year's back-up, senior Dan Bucholz, will likely move to the secondary, leaving a pair of sophomores in reserve, Heath Kelley and Mark Jamison.

"They both have good arms and good size and got a lot of experience playing JV last year," McMartin said. "They're not any further behind than Tim (Connell) was as a sophomore last year. Either could come in and play. It will be nice to see how much they've improved."

Running backs

The Dutch offense rode Schuring for much of its success last year. After sitting out 2004 due to injury, Schuring became the first Central back to top the 1,000-yard rushing mark since 1998, churning for 1,339 yards on 290 carries (4.6 per carry, 121.7 per game), the fourth-highest season total in school history. He's a co-captain for 2006.

"Vance had a very special year," McMartin said. "He's got great vision and is a strong runner. He's fun to watch. Sometimes you forget you're coaching and just watch him carry the ball."

Senior Drew Cheers gained 69 yards on 21 carries and provides capable support.

"When given the opportunity, Drew made the most of it," McMartin said. "He runs hard and runs our zone plays well."

McMartin is also comfortable giving the ball to sophomores Justin Johnson, Jimmy Sikkink or Dustin Veldhuizen.

The S-back position, a combination fullback/wingback/tight end, is open although Johnson got a taste of it last year and is an early favorite. Johnson, Veldhuizen, junior David Housel, sophomore Jacob Nero and transfer Nathan Craft will contend for the starting spot.

"We want to find a guy who does a great job blocking, can get the hard yards in short-yardage situations and can catch the ball," McMartin said. "I think any of them can come in and do a good job."

Offensive line

There are some holes up front, none bigger than that left by graduated all-America honoree Ryan Johnson, but both starting guards return in seniors Clinton Wallace and Ricky De Hamer. Senior Nick Reed and sophomore Owen Haberman last year's outstanding freshman award winner-also saw significant playing time.

They're joined in a wide-open scrap for offensive line positions by senior Joel Van Heukelom, junior Neal Mick and sophomores Jordan Edgerly, Spenser Remick, Robert Cedillo, Mike De Waard, Andrew Strahl, Aaron Corbin and Aron Burk, although Burk could be moved to defensive line.

"Coach (Reid) Evans does a great job with the offensive line," McMartin said. "All the younger guys worked hard in the off season and know we need them to step up. We have to find the right guys and get some chemistry established early. I think it's just a matter of them getting experience and finding five who play well together."

Tight end

Junior Jon Haugen is back at tight end where he was Central's third-leading receiver last season with 16 receptions for 209 yards and two touchdowns.

"Jon has all the tools," McMartin said. "He's continuing to improve as a blocker."

Senior Erik Haberman has also lettered.

"Erik's a great technician and has put on some weight," McMartin said.

Nero could also see time at tight end, along with sophomore Danny Frank.

Receivers

The top four receivers return.

"We have a great group coming back," McMartin said. "It's one of the deepest positions on the team."

That's encouraging because McMartin wants to upgrade the Dutch passing attack this year.

Senior Brad Ryals, a second-team all-conference pick in 2004, grabbed 41 balls for 669 yards and five touchdowns.

"Brad made a lot of big catches," McMartin said.

Huisman, a junior, had 20 catches for 259 yards and senior Billy Fox had 15 receptions for 115 yards with two TDs.

"Cody (Huisman) really stepped up as a slot receiver and Billy (Fox) does a nice job in traffic," McMartin said.

Juniors Cody Wille and Josh Smith are also in the mix with sophomores Kirk Burkle, Waugh, Matthew VerMeer, Zachary Jacobsmeier and Paul Kearney. McMartin likes his young receivers' potential.

"They could be impact guys," he said. "They'll all press for playing time."

Defensive line

As with the offense, the big defensive holes are up front, but there's experience everywhere else as eight starters return.

Senior Taylor Vanden Wynboom started at end in Central's 3-3 stack formation which features two ends and a nose guard. He made 35 tackles last year with one tackle for loss and a fumble recovery.

"We expect Taylor to step up his level of play this year," McMartin said. "We need him to do that."

Junior Nick Mulder moved from tight end during last season and made big strides, finishing with 21 tackles including 6.5 for loss with two sacks, an interception and a pass breakup.

"Nick's got a big body and is a good athlete," McMartin said. "He had a great interception against Wis.-Whitewater that was probably one of our best defensive plays of the year."

Junior Keith Bowers and sophomore J.J. Owens are joined by sophomore converted tight end Joel Wissler and sophomores David Cain and Tim Eilers in contending for time. McMartin said that sophomore Nick Link will likely move up from linebacker.

"He had a great off-season in the weight room," McMartin said.

Stingers

Junior Dustyn Baethke officially made the conversion last year from star running back to Central's stinger position, a hybrid linebacker/defensive end, and grew more comfortable as the season progressed. He was Central's fourth-leading tackler with 60 stops, including 7.5 for loss with two sacks, two interceptions, seven breakups and two fumble recoveries. McMartin anticipates seeing even bigger numbers this year.

"Dustyn did a great job," he said. "He's always around the football. He's a tremendous athlete and we're lucky to have him out there."

Baethke and fellow co-captain Colby Myers, a senior, give the Dutch plenty of experience. Myers, who can also play inside linebacker, was Central's third-leading tackler with 70, including 40 solo tackles and 10 for loss and two sacks with an interception and four pass breakups. But Central fans knew him best last year for his special teams play with a pair of game-changing punt blocks and returns that led to wins at Wartburg and Dubuque.

"Colby just flies around and makes plays," McMartin said. "He could become one of the better players in the Iowa Conference."

Junior Aaron Rasmussen is a two-time letterwinner who made 13 tackles last year.

"We've got to find a place for Aaron," McMartin said. "He's got a great work ethic and loves to hit."

Junior Trenton Blythe had 21 stops and senior Keith Wrich made seven tackles. There was some thought of moving the versatile Blythe to the defensive line.

"We were able to use him in the defensive line in our nickel defense and in some long-yardage situations last year,"

McMartin said. "He's very aggressive and brings a lot of experience."

Wrich has been slowed by injury but is still able to contribute.

"Keith is really good in passing situations," McMartin said. "He's very aggressive and loves to play. He's a great team guy."

Sophomores Curtis Johnson and Jordan Jaspering could also contribute.

Linebackers

The reasons behind junior Andrew Lehn's quick ascension into the starting lineup at linebacker are obvious. Lehn delivered a school-record 133 tackles last year with 74 solo tackles, five stops for loss, two sacks, two interceptions, two pass breakups and a fumble recovery. He was a first-team all-conference pick and was given the Lankelma Award as Central's top underclass player.

"Andrew does a great job," McMartin said. "He's got a nose for the ball. He has a lot of fun playing football and is fun to watch. He really gets after it."

Junior Greg Altmaier also stepped into a starting spot, making 47 tackles with five for loss, two sacks and two breakups.

"Greg is really good against the run," McMartin said. "He's gotten stronger and faster and is also very good on special teams."

A pair of other special teams standouts, junior Scott Paja and sophomore Ryan Thompson, will likely see increased playing time at linebacker as well. Paja made 15 tackles last year.

"Scott (Paja) has the skill to be an impact player," McMartin said. "Ryan runs and moves very well. He'll be hard to keep off the field."

McMartin also likes sophomores Justin Ver Steeg, Jeremy Swafford and Ramy Mosbah.

"If those three can stay healthy they could all help us," he said.

Defensive backs

Two starters are well-established. Senior cornerback Brett Doud, a team co-captain, was a first-team all-league pick as both a defensive back and kick returner. He made 49 tackles with a team-high five interceptions and six pass breakups.

"Brett's a tremendous athlete and a fierce competitor," McMartin said. "He's a huge contributor on the defense and on special teams. He knows what it takes to win."

The free safety spot is equally stable with senior Ben Bollard entering his third year as the starter. He was Central's second-leading tackler with 78, including 45 solos. An all-America honoree in track and field, Bollard led the Dutch with eight pass breakups.

"Ben's very fast, loves to hit and is continuing to develop good instincts," McMartin said. "He works really hard. It's nice to have someone in the middle of the field with his experience."

The other cornerback spot is up for grabs. Bucholz is making the move from quarterback in his final Central season and looks like a serious contender.

"He's a good athlete who works very hard," McMartin said. "You'd like to see him get on the field as a senior."

Another track and field all-America honoree, junior Guy Dierikx, will play as well.

"Guy's gotten better every year," McMartin said. "He started against Dubuque last year and made some key plays. He's got great speed and is very competitive. He's a great team guy who's going to do some good things for us."

Junior Marc Badeaux also has some experience, making nine tackles, but is coming off surgery.

"Marc played a lot as a nickel back before he got hurt," McMartin said. "He's a hard hitter who has become more comfortable with our defense. He'll hit anything that moves."

Sophomore Chad Eisenman can help at free safety and is a likely contributor on special teams after a strong effort in the weight room, McMartin said. Sophomore Zach Zellweger earned all-America honors in indoor track and field and will compete at cornerback and McMartin also likes junior Austen Schueler.

"Austen's done a nice job," McMartin said. "He's a heady player who always knows where he's supposed to be."

The Dutch will also get help from sophomore Andrew Taylor, who moved over from running back.

Getting better

While delighted with last year's performance, McMartin is focusing on improvement.

"We have to solidify our offensive line and defensive line," He said. "We have to be better in the passing game.

Offensively we want to keep it simple but we have to find ways to get our playmakers the ball. And you can always improve on execution.

"Defensively we've got to be better on third down and continue to improve against the run. We did a good job of not giving up big plays and people rose up at key times in big games with timely turnovers or game-saving tackles. Our focus this year will be to continue to improve in all facets."

The freshmen

McMartin brought in a strong recruiting class a year ago and he's eager to see how this season's newcomers match up.

"We brought in players at positions where we needed help," he said. "I think it will be a good group. We've got players from California, Florida, Arizona, Missouri, Illinois and Minnesota, so they're coming from all over the place, but we've got some good Iowa kids as well."

The Iowa Conference

While Central has an experienced club, McMartin also sees lots of veteran talent as he looks around a balanced Iowa Conference.

Coe, which shared the crown with Central last year, and Wartburg get the most title mention but McMartin said there are other threats as well.

"It's a wide-open race again," McMartin said. "The Iowa Conference just gets tougher and tougher.

As McMartin enters his third season at the helm, he's already got seniority in the league over new coaches who were hired in the off-season at Cornell, Buena Vista, Loras and Wartburg.

"It will be really interesting with all the new coaches in the league," McMartin said. "The energy level created with a new coach can be a real shot in the arm for those teams."

But the Dutch won't focus on the opposition, McMartin said.

"Our attitude hasn't changed," he said. "We know we have to work hard in the weight room and in practice each week because we're going to be challenged."

The staff

While Central continues to have one of the most experienced coaching staffs in Division III, there's a significant temporary departure in 2006. After 39 years with the Dutch, assistant coach Dick Bowzer is on a faculty sabbatical for 2006-07 and steps away for a year.

But there's another void Dutch Nation is feeling in facing the first season since the passing of former Hall of Fame head coach Ron Schipper, who died in late March near his home in Holland, Mich. While he retired after the 1996 season,

Schipper was a frequent visitor to Kuyper Stadium and remained a meticulous viewer of Central game tapes each week as well as a bedrock of support to McMartin and the Dutch.

Yet Schipper's impact remains. Eight members of the Central staff played for Schipper and McMartin welcomes back former Dutch lineman Eric Jones, who served as a Central assistant for eight seasons then spent the past three years as dean of students at Waukee High School before returning to Pella.

"I'm really proud of our staff," McMartin said. "We've got great coaches who really care about the players and treat them the right way. They've been winners in the past and they know how to get it done. They're fun to work with and be around."

McMartin also cites the football support staff, starting at the top with Central president David Roe, who serves as the team's kicking coach, as well as athletics director Al Dorenkamp, associate director John Edwards, head athletic trainer Leslie Duinink and office manager Jeffy Schuring. The Dutch benefit from a medical staff that supports Duinink, including physical therapist Travis Sterling, who also serves as a player development assistant, physician Dr. Kurt Vander Ploeg and orthopaedic specialist Dr. Dan Vande Lune, as well as Central exercise science chair Dave Pavlat.

"They're the unsung heroes of this program," McMartin said. "The entire Central community provides tremendous support and helps our players perform at a high level. It's a real family here and that makes it special."

Unfamiliar ground

The non-conference schedule should leave the Dutch well-prepared for a rugged league slate as Central has added a pair of highly regarded opponents.

Central travels to St. Paul, Minn. Sept. 2 for its first regular-season meeting with St. Thomas. The teams' only previous meeting was Central's dramatic 33-32 NCAA Division III playoff quarterfinal win in 1990.

Then the Dutch return home but will be treading on some unfamiliar ground as newly renovated A.N. Kuyper Stadium debuts Sept. 9. A new Fieldturf artificial playing surface is being installed, along with a new track facility as part of a \$2.5 million project.

Central takes on Hope (Mich.) in the inaugural contest. It will be a bittersweet day as Schipper was a Hope graduate and was eagerly looking forward to the first football clash between the two sister schools, both affiliated with the Reformed Church in America. Schipper and his family will be honored prior to kick-off.

"We are thrilled with the changes we're making at Kuyper Stadium," McMartin said. "This venue has seen many, many great games in the past and will continue to in the future."

Jeff Bovee

Head coach

Jeff Bovee is in his fourth season as head men's and women's cross country coach at Central. Bovee also serves as assistant men's and women's track and field coach.

Central runners have earned USCCCA Division III all-region honors five times during his tenure. Distance runners have also showed dramatic progress in track and field under Bovee, scoring 133 points in 2005 Iowa Conference indoor and outdoor meets and 112 in 2006, after scoring 68 points in 2004 and 61 in 2003.

Bovee was the head men's and women's track and cross country coach at Parkland Junior College (Ill.) from 1996-2000. He was a graduate assistant coach in both sports at Eastern Illinois University in 1995-96. Bovee, a native of Glendale, Ariz., previously was a high school girls' and boys' track and cross country assistant there at Ironwood and Apollo high schools.

A graduate of the University of Arizona, Bovee served as co-captain of the school's track and field team for two seasons. He was a four-time track and field letterwinner and three-time cross country letterwinner for the Wildcats. He was a Pac-10 Conference placewinner in the 800 meters in track and a NCAA national meet participant in cross country.

Bovee received a master's degree from Eastern Illinois and is pursuing a doctoral degree at the University of Illinois.

Stephen Fyfe

Assistant coach

Stephen Fyfe is in his eighth season as assistant men's and women's cross country coach at Central. He's also an assistant for the men's and women's track and field squads. A 1987 Central graduate, Fyfe earned three varsity letters in cross country and four in track and field. He continues to compete in road races and has completed seven marathons. Fyfe received his masters and doctoral degrees at Iowa State University and serves as an assistant professor of computer science at Central.

Jay Rhoten

Assistant coach

Former all-American decathlete Jay Rhoten is in his first season as assistant men's and women's cross country coach at Central.

Rhoten, a 1998 Central graduate, is also in his second year as an assistant track and field coach for the Dutch.

A three-time Iowa Conference men's track and field MVP, Rhoten swept the 1998 NCAA Div. III Central Region men's indoor and outdoor track and field athlete of the year awards presented by the U.S. Track and Field Coaches Association. He placed second in the NCAA Division III decathlon in 1998 after finishing sixth the previous year. He was fourth in the 1998 Drake Relays decathlon, and second among university and college competitors. Also a two-time team MVP and a team captain, Rhoten placed in five events at the 1998 Iowa Conference meet as the Dutch took the men's team title for the third time in his four seasons.

Outlook

Last year's third-place Iowa Conference finish was the Central College men's cross country team's best since 1992. The squad's ninth-place showing at the NCAA Division III Central Region meet was a 10-place jump over 2002, the year prior to coach Jeff Bovee's arrival.

Taking the next step--an outright second-place conference finish and maybe a berth in the NCAA Division III national meet--hasn't been achieved in 25 years, yet Bovee quietly suggests it's time for his runners to put it in their sights.

"The potential for a top-two finish is there," he said. "With so many seniors on this year's team, there's a sense of urgency. We've got all kinds of great leadership and great kids who have been very instrumental in bringing the program to this level. They're highly motivated and they've really trained hard over the summer."

Three strong leaders also were lost to graduation but four of the top seven are back, headed by senior Adam Wolf, the team MVP. He earned all-conference recognition by placing fourth in the league meet, won the Central Dutch Invitational and was second at the St. Olaf (Minn.) Invitational. His 25:18 effort at the Augustana (Ill.) Invitational Sept. 23 was the team's season-best 8,000-meter time and ranks him fifth on Central's all-time list of top runners.

Wolf enters 2006 with lofty ambitions. Bovee sees him as a contender for the league individual title as well as an NCAA

berth.

"I think Adam will be among three of the favorites to win the conference," Bovee said. "That's going to be Adam's goal and he certainly has that capability."

Wolf slipped to 44th at the Division III regional meet last year, a finish Bovee termed misleading.

"He was battling a cold," Bovee said. "Otherwise, I think he might have sneaked in (to the national meet)."

Wolf is joined as co-captain by senior Brian Respeliers. A three-time letterwinner, Respeliers held the No. 6 or 7 spot in the lineup last year but made dramatic progress last spring, earning an NCAA Division III meet berth in the 800 meters.

"I think Brian's NCAA experience in track and field will carry over," Bovee said. "He's been there and knows what it takes. He made such huge improvement and is a great role model for the rest of the team."

"He's a big guy and more of a middle-distance guy, but I really think he can be a top-five runner for us. He's someone who needs to keep improving for us to reach our goal of an NCAA berth."

Respeliers will be the more vocal captain.

"Adam (Wolf) is pretty quiet, but he can get people fired up when he needs to," Bovee said. "Last year, in the middle of a race, he'd often chirp in another guy's ear to help get him going. I think he and Brian are going to complement each other well."

Another senior looking for improvement is Brett Jones, also a three-time letterwinner. He was 34th at the league meet but was an impressive 48th at the NCAA regional and was Central's No. 3 or 4 runner much of the year. Jones finished in 26:23 at the Augustana meet.

"Brett ran really well throughout the season but got sick right before the conference meet," Bovee said. "His strength is the longer races and I think can be a top-15 contender in the conference."

Bovee has similar hopes for senior three-time letterwinner Joe Jefferson who was 18th in the conference and in Central's top three in four meets. He placed ninth in the 10,000 meters at the league track meet in May.

"He missed about half of his training during track season because of illness so to finish as well as he did was pretty promising. Cross country is the forte of both Joe and Brett. They love the longer races and the tough courses."

A wild card in determining Central's fortunes is junior Brett Dietrich, who returns after missing most of last season with injury.

"It would be huge for us if Brett would be able to reach his full potential," Bovee said. "He's such a talented kid. He could still be a great runner. He's a gamer who really puts it together in the tough races. If he could just stay healthy for 12 months, he could be a 31-minute guy in the 10,000 meters."

The Dutch also regain the services of senior Chase Ungs, who was Central's No. 7 runner at the 2004 league meet but spent last fall in Europe through the popular Central Abroad program.

"Chase will be pushing our top five this year on a consistent basis," Bovee said. "He is a strong leader. He keeps things loose when the team needs that but can bring intensity and a needed boost when necessary."

Sophomore Teddy Clark had a steady debut season with Central's junior varsity last year.

"He's gotten a lot stronger," Bovee said. "I see Teddy as a varsity guy. How far he climbs depends on how his summer training goes."

Bovee also lists junior Eric Sink and sophomores James Armstead, Tyler Schipper and Jaron Byrum as possible varsity contributors. Byrum earned his first letter last season.

The expected leader of the freshman class is Alex Miller of Adel, a strong middle-distance runner who earned a state cross country meet berth as an individual runner for Waukeg.

"Alex will be very good in track and has a lot of potential, but it may take until his sophomore or junior year to adjust to running 8,000 meters," Bovee said. "But he has definite potential to be a top-seven guy this year."

Pierre Taylor and Derrick Padovich, who ran at Oswego (Ill.) High School, as did Clark, show promise.

"They could definitely be our top-end JV runners this year and be pretty solid runners down the road," Bovee said.

Bovee sees Wolf as the clear team leader.

"After that, we'll have a really tight group," he said. "We may have only 20-45 seconds separating the rest of our top seven."

Central was third in the league last year behind Wartburg and Luther. Both of the latter two clubs will contend again and a strong freshman class could help Loras make a push.

Central hasn't had an individual NCAA Division III men's meet qualifier since Andy Goodman in 1994 and hasn't sent a team to the national meet since 1980. Bovee wants his team thinking about ending that drought, which would require a fifth-place team finish in the regional after placing ninth last year.

"We're really going to try to get that fifth spot," he said. "The difference between ninth and fifth last year was an average of 20-25 seconds for each guy and our guys have been doing that each year. Certainly it gets progressively more difficult to do that, but I think we have that capability. I think it's going to be an exciting year."

Jeff Bovee

Head coach

Jeff Bovee is in his fourth season as head men's and women's cross country coach at Central. Bovee also serves as assistant men's and women's track and field coach.

Central runners have earned USCCCA Division III all-region honors five times during his tenure. Distance runners have also showed dramatic progress in track and field under Bovee, scoring 133 points in 2005 Iowa Conference indoor and outdoor meets and 112 in 2006, after scoring 68 points in 2004 and 61 in 2003.

Bovee was the head men's and women's track and cross country coach at Parkland Junior College (Ill.) from 1996-2000. He was a graduate assistant coach in both sports at Eastern Illinois University in 1995-96. Bovee, a native of Glendale, Ariz., previously was a high school girls' and boys' track and cross country assistant there at Ironwood and Apollo high schools.

A graduate of the University of Arizona, Bovee served as co-captain of the school's track and field team for two seasons. He was a four-time track and field letterwinner and three-time cross country letterwinner for the Wildcats. He was a Pac-10 Conference placewinner in the 800 meters in track and a NCAA national meet participant in cross country.

Bovee received a master's degree from Eastern Illinois and is pursuing a doctoral degree at the University of Illinois.

Outlook

Coach Jeff Bovee isn't underestimating the challenge of replacing five of the Central College women's cross country team's top seven runners from 2005.

Yet he enters his fourth season excited about his squad's prospects and even entertaining notions of exceeding the accomplishments of last year's veteran squad.

There's nothing like a bumper crop of incoming talent to put a smile on a coach's face. There are 16 freshmen on the 2006 roster and many are likely to contend for varsity spots.

"We don't have a very experienced group," Bovee said. "We're fortunate we've got such a strong group coming in. This is the best recruiting class we've had since I've been here. I think we'll be very strong."

Even the team's leaders will be young. The squad captain is a sophomore, Jess Clark, and the only other returning member of last year's top seven is her classmate Nicki Thomas. Sophomore Chantelle MacVey is the only other letterwinner back while sophomore Amanda Petro also returns.

"Jess (Clark) has really shown that she's the most ready to step up and lead," Bovee said. "Not only because of her running ability, but because of her work ethic and her ability to communicate and lead us to where we need to go."

Clark was Central's No. 5 runner much of last year, placing 32nd at the Iowa Conference meet and turning in her career-best 6,000-meter time of 24:19 at the Augustana Invitational Sept. 23.

But Thomas is the team leader at the finish line. She was Central's No. 2 runner in every meet as a freshman, finished 19th in the Iowa Conference and also ran her career-best at the Augustana meet, in 23:05.

Bringing the loftiest high school credentials among the freshmen are Angie Berry of Norwalk and Amber Mayer of Essex, a Shenandoah High School grad. They finished second and sixth, respectively, in the 3,000 meters at the Class 3A state high school meet in May. And it will be a surprise if the top seven doesn't include Constance Eshelman, a junior college transfer from Ellsworth and a Nodaway Valley High School grad from Bridgewater. Bovee notes that Eshelman competed in two meets last fall that included Central and both times ran fast enough to be the No. 3 finisher for the Dutch.

"She's already running 60 miles a week," Bovee said. "She'll be a very solid runner and I think is going to improve rapidly once she gets here."

Other freshmen contenders include Rachelle Tipton of Newton, a standout in the 400 and 800 meters who was the No. 2 runner on Newton's cross country squad, which qualified for the Class 4A state meet.

"The transition from 4,000 meters (in high school) to 6,000 meters will be more difficult for her than for some of the others, but she's a good athlete," Bovee said.

Kelsey Tompkins of Webster City was an individual Class 3A state qualifier.

"Kelsey's really a sleeper," Bovee said. "I think she could do some great things."

Another middle-distance runner, Jenni Hufford, had a solid high school cross country career at Ankeny.

"Once she adjusts to the longer distance, she should do pretty well," Bovee said.

Amanda Mosinski, a state high school track qualifier in the 400 meter hurdles, was still debating on whether to contin-

ue running cross country in college, but Bovee would love having her on the squad.

"She's very athletic and I think could surprise a lot of people," he said.

Another potential surprise is Amy Ledvina of Toledo, a South Tama High School standout, who was eighth in the 3,000 meters at the state meet.

"She started out as a shot putter her freshman year and turned into a very strong distance runner," Bovee said. "She could be very good."

Bovee is also looking for good things from freshmen Liz Arentsen of Waukee, Mandie Barkley of Fort Dodge, Heather Shives of Knoxville and Ashley Wiederin of Bedford.

Bovee emphasizes that his lineup is far from settled.

"The times this fall will help quickly sort it out," he said. "We have several freshmen who could make varsity, depending on what they do over the summer."

Central was third in the Iowa Conference the past two seasons. Matching that finish with so many newcomers may be attainable, but not easy. Bovee tabs defending champ Wartburg as the favorite but thinks Luther will make a run at the top spot and notes that Simpson also enjoyed a solid recruiting year.

"Within the next few years I expect this to be a team that's contending for the conference title," Bovee said.

But don't look for many top finishes early this fall with Central's rookie-laden roster. Bovee knows the ride will be a bumpy one, yet senses some intangibles that will yield success before the season's end.

"I think these freshmen have a work ethic and a passion for the sport in general that the team hasn't had," Bovee said. "We've had some individuals who were willing to go beyond practice time with their work but this year I think we have a lot of runners like that who really live and breathe it. A lot of them are already asking such great questions. They want to understand why they're doing what they're doing each day and how to get better."

Outlook

Reinforcements for an already experienced roster have given coach Jodee Schaben hope for a turnaround in her third season as Central College women's golf coach.

Four of the top five players from last season's squad return. The Dutch slipped a notch to fifth place in the Iowa Conference but Schaben saw enough promise to convince her that a move in the other direction is a realistic hope.

Team MVP Sharilyne Hoekstra is one of three senior co-captains. An all-conference performer with an eighth-place finish in the league meet, Hoekstra posted a team-best 84.8 stroke average last fall.

"I don't see anyone taking the number one spot from Sharilyne," Schaben said. "She has the playing skills and the talent, and last fall she worked hard on the mental side of the game. She's the whole package now. She won't let one bad shot take her out of it."

Fellow captains Brooke Bachelder and Jessica Monical filled the number two and three positions with averages of 86.9 and 90.9 respectively. Schaben expects improvement from both. Monical rebuilt her swing last year while Bachelder is coming off a solid spring season.

Also returning is sophomore Jordan Williams, who posted a 91.1 mark.

"If Jordan can continue to increase her distance she could push to be number three because her short game is always strong," Schaben said.

Juniors Abby Dean and Amanda Sullivan are in the picture but both missed the spring campaign while studying in Europe through Central Abroad.

"It depends on how much the season off affects them and how hard they've been working," Schaben said.

One player Schaben knows has put in the practice time is sophomore Meghan Swella, who is making dramatic progress after a bumpy debut season.

"Meghan has been working endless hours and I'm excited to see what she has when she comes back," Schaben said.

No positions are set because Schaben finally has some of the depth she's worked hard to develop since taking over the program.

But the Dutch also gain the services of highly regarded junior transfer Emily Bensink of Pella, who Schaben thinks has top-three potential, as well as freshmen Eva Downes of Woodstock, Ill., Alyssa Mowery of Fairmont, Minn. and Ashley Porter of Ankeny.

"I really see any of the 11 competing for a spot, depending on what they've been doing in the off-season," Schaben said. "I foresee more quality throughout the line-up and that's good because it sends the message that no spot is guaranteed. It will keep the players motivated."

Even with improvement, making a move in the league standings will be a challenge.

"Wartburg is still the top contender in the league," Schaben said. "Buena Vista is very strong, Simpson is strong and Loras has made a step up as well. But I think our team can compete. We showed that last spring."

The new lineup will get an early test as the schedule now opens with the Wis.-Eau Claire Invitational, which will feature many of the region's top Division III squads.

"I want our players to see the talent that's out there," Schaben said. "It's not an overly challenging course and will give us a good look at where we stand in the region."

Schaben is also enthused that the returnees and new players are serious enough about their games to welcome the chance to play Central's demanding home course, Pella's Bos Landen Golf Resort.

"I've been very deliberate in trying to find players who want to play courses where it's not just how far you can hit it," she said. "Last year we worked a lot on developing our mental game. Now we also need to work on course strategy and smart play. Bos Landen gives us a big advantage with that and we can take those skills to other courses. The players are excited about it."

Garry Laidlaw

Head Coach

Garry Laidlaw is in his ninth year as head men's soccer coach at Central.

Inheriting a program that had never previously approached the .500 mark, Laidlaw engineered a turnaround which has produced a 54-18-3 (.740) mark over the past four years. His career mark is 71-68-7. Laidlaw was tabbed as the Iowa Conference coach of the year in 2002, after guiding his team to a 16-0-1 regular season. The Dutch were 15-3-1 in 2005 and tied for second place in the league at 6-1-1.

Previously Laidlaw served as head boys' soccer coach at Central High School in Champaign, Ill. for five seasons and also piloted the girls' squad for one year. He was named Illinois sectional coach of the year in 1995.

Born in England, Laidlaw grew up playing soccer in South Africa and Canada. He received his bachelor's degree from Eastern Illinois University where he was a three-time all-conference player and team captain. He was also a two-time all-region pick and was named the Mid-Continent Conference player of the year. Laidlaw later earned a tryout with the Wichita Wings of the Major Indoor Soccer League.

Laidlaw received a master's degree in physical education from Eastern Illinois in 1991. He taught physical education at St. Mathew's School in Champaign, Ill. for six years. At Central, he also serves as an academic counselor and exercise science instructor.

Outlook

See how far they've come.

When coach Garry Laidlaw met his first Central College men's soccer team in 1998, there weren't even enough players to hold a scrimmage and barely enough to stage a practice. The Dutch hadn't even come within three games of the .500 mark and his undermanned squad struggled to a 3-14-1 record in his first season.

But Central has posted a 54-18-2 mark over the past four seasons. The Dutch preseason roster numbers more than 40 players and includes nine returning starters from a 15-3-1 campaign that nearly landed the program's first NCAA Division III tournament berth and finished just a half game out of first place in the Iowa Conference.

The only thing separating Central from a first-ever conference title and NCAA trip are a few favorable kicks, Laidlaw said.

"We're good enough, but there are probably at least three teams in the conference that are good enough," he said. "It comes down to doing it on the day you play the game. We need a little luck. A bounce of the ball here or there could make the difference. The teams are dead even, but we maybe need that one shot that hit the bar last year to go in."

Forwards

The Dutch have plenty of players who could be the one to put that shot in the net. Central's top seven scorers return, led by first-team all-West Region forward Cody Stoermer, now a junior. He set school season records for assists (10) and shots (60) while scoring 13 goals. Sophomore forward Clint Schreiber notched eight goals, including a spectacular one off a midfield kickoff that landed on ESPN's "SportsCenter."

"You know what you're going to get every time out with both of those guys," Laidlaw said.

Senior Nate Bill is also a returning starter up front. He had four goals and an assist.

A transfer from Hampden-Sydney (Va.), junior Jamie Johnson of Marion, could force his way into the picture.

"He's a big, strong player who makes a good target," Laidlaw said.

First-team all-stater Ryan Rink of Cedar Falls and all-star game participant Chris Heffling of Johnston are freshman scoring threats.

"Chris (Heffling) was an attacking midfielder in high school," Laidlaw said. "We may explore using him as an outside midfielder or even up front because he can score goals. He's a good passer with good vision."

"Ryan (Rink) is extremely quick and has a great shot. He's very shifty and can pose problems for teams."

Laidlaw also expects to call on veterans Toby Neal and Brett Anderson, both seniors, and junior Tyman Wiley, either up front or in the midfield.

"They're going to push," Laidlaw said. "I'm hoping they continue to improve and also help lead the team."

Pushing as well will be freshman Matt Westfall of St. Joseph, Mo.

Midfielders

The Dutch are even more well-stocked in the midfield. Sophomore Cruz Herr and junior Blake Scott were both second-team all-conference picks last season while sophomore Jeff Adamczyk is also back.

"This is the most depth we've ever had in the midfield," Laidlaw said.

Herr had three goals and an assist, Scott notched three goals with four assists, and Adamczyk ranked third among Central's point-producers with three goals and five assists.

"Cruz (Herr) had a fantastic freshman year," Laidlaw said. "He's just so solid back there and is a great tackler. He's got a super engine and can run all day."

"Blake (Scott) is so consistent and reliable. He's a good passer and is very good in the air."

"We may play Jeff (Adamczyk) at forward. He's another versatile player who can run all day. He's quick, shifty and can score goals."

Central gets an additional boost with the return of senior Eric McDonald, who can play midfield or forward. He scored six goals in 2004 but missed nearly all of 2005 with a broken leg.

"I think the injury helped him in a way," Laidlaw said. "He learned to appreciate having the ability to go out there and play. If he's fully recovered-and that's the big question-he's definitely got the talent to help us."

Other possibilities include senior Ryan Petersen, sophomore Ben Heithoff, who could also play in the back, and sophomores Chris Purdue and Reid Petersen.

"Ben (Heithoff) is good enough to find some time," Laidlaw said. "Chris (Purdue) has worked very hard in the off-season. Technically and tactically, he's already there. He could challenge. And Reid (Petersen) has played both midfield and forward and will push hard for increased playing time."

Laidlaw is also looking at freshmen Nathan Dorpinghaus of Albia, Ben Lewis of Fort Madison, Kyle Pekovitch of Lake Zurich, Ill., Drew Voorhees of Washington, Ill. and Jeremy Grider of Cedar Falls.

"They're all similar players," he said. "They're quick and can get up and down the touchline to offer support and serve the ball."

"How much they play depends on how quickly they adjust. But we've finally reached the point where we don't have to rely so heavily on freshmen. Even though we lost a lot of quality from last year's team, I feel pretty good about the core we have coming back."

Backs

The key to the season is rebuilding the defense. Central graduated second-team back Conrad Vernon and outside defender Nick Mohwinkle, leaving senior Eric Bentzinger and junior Jason Winslow as the returning starters.

"That's an area we'll be looking at early in the preseason," Laidlaw said. "We definitely need to get it shored up. It might mean making a change of formation and looking at new systems of play. We'll determine all that in the preseason."

Bentzinger is well-prepared to serve as the defensive backbone.

"He's a steady force back there," Laidlaw said.

Winslow will likely remain in the back as well.

"Jason's very versatile," Laidlaw said. "We can leave him there or move him up. He's a very good attacking player but willing to sacrifice for the good of the team and play where we need him."

Sophomore Scott Erie could also help after seeing time at forward last year.

"Scott has a lot to offer," Laidlaw said. "But he had an injury and was never able to get back in the lineup. He's had off-season surgery which hopefully corrects the problem because he's one of the most talented players on the team."

Sophomore Ben Heithoff could move back from the midfield.

"He can play almost any position on the team," Laidlaw said. "He did play a little in back last year. I think Ben is ready to come in and compete."

Freshman candidates include Erik Lundgren of Long Grove, Ill., Jaime Romero of Oswego, Ill., Matt Johnson of Albia, Andrew Messer of Norwalk, Brian O'Malley of Peoria, Ill. and Dustin Delvaux of Altoona.

The nice part is the Dutch have options.

"One thing we have is depth," he said. "The challenges for positions will be greater than ever. It will create a healthy, competitive atmosphere in our training."

Goalkeepers

Sophomore Greg Foote won the goalkeeper job as a rookie, making 14 starts and allowing 1.05 goals per game while posting a 12-2-1 record with 77 saves and three shutouts. He'll be pushed by junior Trent Payne, who had seven saves in six games, as well as junior college transfer Adam Chrestman of Rochelle, Ill.

"Greg (Foote) is coming off a solid freshman year as he was able to win and hold the starting position," Laidlaw said. "But Trent (Payne) will challenge and we're excited about Adam (Chrestman). I think he will come in and challenge as well. It's the most depth we've had."

But Laidlaw would prefer to not share the goalkeeping duties.

"I'd prefer to have someone win it outright," he said. "But if we need the non-conference season to find that out, we'll do that and then go with one for the conference matches."

The road ahead

Laidlaw calls Wartburg and Loras the teams to beat in the Iowa Conference, with Simpson and Luther in the mix as well. But the league's increasing strength could prove beneficial when NCAA tourney bids are awarded.

"The fact that two teams from our league reached the final 16 last year really helps," Laidlaw said. "It shows our conference is getting respect and deservedly so. With the expanded field this year, there's a good possibility of getting two teams from the Iowa Conference in again."

A strong non-conference showing is needed as well and the Dutch have beefed up the schedule, taking on seven schools from the highly regarded Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, playing six on the road.

"We feel we're playing some of the strongest teams the region offers," Laidlaw said. "What that will do is help us become hardened to playing tough competition and help prepare us for the conference. We want to have a schedule where every game we play is competitive so that we're consistently playing at the highest level."

The Dutch program is in position to attain new heights.

"The returning players are coming off the success we had last year and the hunger for more is there," Laidlaw said. "The work they've been putting in during the off-season is there. Everything is in place, we've just got to do it on the day we play."

In his first season at Central in 2004, Burns piloted a small, inexperienced squad to a surprising 8-8-1 record and an Iowa Conference tournament berth. It was the 20th time in his 23 seasons as a collegiate head coach that his squad posted a .500 record or better. The 2005 squad jumped to a 7-1 start but lost four starters to injury and closed at 7-11, giving Burns a 15-19-1 Central record and a 267-168-24 career mark (.607).

Burns was previously the head women's soccer coach for five years at Gordon College (Mass.). He has coaching experience at all NCAA division levels. He spent five years at Div. I Drury University (Mo.), was head women's coach at Mount Holyoke College (Mass.) for six seasons and was the men's head soccer coach at Mercyhurst College (Pa.) and St. Mary's University (Minn.) for three seasons each.

Burns is a five-time conference coach of the year and has coached 20 teams with cumulative grade point averages of 3.0 or better.

A devout student of coaching philosophy, Burns has authored some 40 articles in soccer and coaching publications.

Burns is a graduate of Northwest Nazarene University (Idaho) and earned a master's degree at California State University, Los Angeles.

Outlook

The Central College women's soccer team is eyeing a return to the Iowa Conference tournament after a year's absence.

Following a promising 7-1 non-conference start, injuries and an offensive drought proved costly in league play last season and the Dutch closed at 7-11.

Seven starters return, including two-time all-Iowa Conference goalkeeper Ashley Veigelt, back for her senior year. Nine of Central's losses last year were by two goals or less, fueling thoughts of a possible turnaround.

"Last year we lost a lot of games 1-0 and 2-1 against the teams we were competing with for the tournament," coach Rick Burns said. "If we can beat three of those teams, we could squeeze into that last spot. That would be a big step for us."

A lack of depth was a liability last year and remains a concern.

"We only played 11-13 players," Burns said. "If players are going to go a full 90 minutes, you have to balance being fit and being fresh, which means limiting training. It's a fine line. You have to be in shape but you have to have fresh legs."

However Burns said the Dutch rotation could go a bit deeper this year, which would likely produce favorable results.

"The infusion of a couple strong transfers and a few touted freshmen in addition to the eight returning starters gives me great hope," Burns said.

Forwards

A big chunk of the scoring load fell on the shoulders of junior Tori Rittman and fortunately, she's talented enough to handle it. Rittman scored 11 goals with five assists, the sixth-highest season goals total in the program's history. Her running mate up front is sophomore Stephanie Ellwanger, who had three goals and two assists.

"Tori (Rittman) is a very good player," Burns said. "I'm hoping that with some other people we can bring some of the pressure off of her."

Burns is even toying with moving Rittman back slightly and pushing Ellwanger up to alleviate that pressure.

"Steph (Ellwanger) is a tough, physical player who holds the ball well," Burns said. "We may move her up to a point forward position."

Midfield

Burns thinks the Dutch midfield will be stronger. Sophomore Sarah Frese and junior Rose Feldman have some experience there and Burns thinks the Dutch have picked up some additional speed with freshmen Kelli Hancock of Cedar Falls, Jenna Hindman of Swisher and Jessica Steward of Cedar Falls. Hancock is especially likely to make a quick impact, Burns

said.

Backs

The Dutch defense remains the team's strength. Senior Megan Augustin and sophomores Erin Sheehan and Amy Van Der Kamp return. Feldman also has experience in the back.

"They are wily and seasoned veterans who are full of enthusiasm," Burns said. "We'll have a good, strong, experienced back four."

Sheehan, who could also be used in the midfield, "will be one of our stronger players," Burns said.

Van Der Kamp showed great promise in her rookie year, but had the season cut short by injury in the seventh game.

Goalkeeper

Central is deepest in goal. Veigelt made 133 saves in 18 games, posting a 1.49 goals-allowed average with five shutouts.

She is backed by junior Michelle Gilbert, a highly regarded transfer from Southwest State (Minn.) who played high school soccer at Valley in West Des Moines. However Burns said it's not likely Gilbert will be idle as she can probably be used in the field.

Central also has a solid freshman goalkeeper in Abby Marshall of Newton.

The league

Defending champ Loras retains the Iowa Conference favorite's tag, Burns said, with pressure coming from Wartburg. He views Cornell, Coe, Buena Vista and Central as the chief contenders for the sixth league playoff position.

Burns relied on Central's defensive strength last year in his tactics but hopes to utilize some selective offensive aggressiveness in 2006.

"Against the top teams we'll still have to sit back, defend and rely on the counterattack," he said. "But against two-thirds of the teams on the schedule, I think we can play more even up."

Burns likes his team's intangibles, particularly the guidance provided by his seniors, Augustin and Veigelt.

"Megan and Ashley are both enthusiastic," Burns said. "They're very loyal and have hung in there for four years. They will give us strong leadership on and off the field as we cycle through the inevitable phases of the season."

And Burns will continue to chart his players' progress through measures other than the scoreboard.

"My goal is that they play with strong spirits and kind hearts," he said. "I hope that they will train and play with vigor, enjoy the experience and have the grace to accept whatever happens. My star burns bright with anticipation of the upcoming season."

Outlook

How well some newcomers fill out the lineup will likely determine the Central College women's tennis team's progress in 2006.

Five of last season's top six players are back. The Dutch placed fourth in the Iowa Conference but slipped to an uncharacteristic 5-8 dual meet record, only Central's fifth losing mark in 20 seasons.

But the squad enters 2006 in good shape at the top of the lineup. Senior Kristin Kovar and sophomore Hillary Baehr handled the No. 1 and 2 singles positions last year.

"They should be the top two again unless someone really surprises me," coach Doug Stursma said.

Kovar was an all-Iowa Conference honoree, finishing fourth at No. 1 singles. She boasts a 29-13 career singles record despite having to battle for a 6-8 mark after moving to the No. 1 position last season.

"Kristin's one of the better players in the league," Stursma said.

Baehr was 8-5 and also took all-conference honors, finishing fourth at No. 2 singles.

"Hillary came on strong at the end of last season," Stursma said. "She may come back and push Kristin.

Juniors Katie Moglestad, Jennifer Knobbe and Whitney Visser, who played at Nos. 3, 5 and 6 singles, respectively return. Moglestad was 6-10 after going 9-5 in 2004, Knobbe was 8-7 and Visser was 9-6. Junior Maureen Khairallah, a three-time letterwinner, and sophomore Shela Cleveland are among those contending for the open position. Khairallah was part of the third-place No. 3 doubles team at the league meet, posting a 6-9 mark.

"We definitely have some experienced players coming back," Stursma said.

Newcomers likely to challenge include freshmen Faith Bliss of Ottumwa and Rachel Chambers of Rochester, Minn.

"I think they have some potential to help," Stursma said. "The players in the bottom half of the lineup are all so close that who knows what order they'll be in?"

Stursma views Coe as the conference favorite with Luther in the hunt again. Making a move beyond last year's fourth-place finish won't be easy, he said.

"Hopefully we can sneak up on some teams but it will be a real challenge," he said.

"But I feel like our team can be just as strong as last year. We have a little more experience and I'm hoping a couple of the freshmen might make us a little stronger at the bottom of the lineup."

Kent Clayberg

Head coach

Kent Clayberg is entering his fourth season as head volleyball coach and his seventh year on the Central volleyball staff. He was an assistant coach for four years before being promoted to associate head coach in 2002 and then head coach in 2003.

A 1990 Central graduate, Clayberg has compiled a 54-19 record in two seasons as head coach, winning two Iowa Conference titles and two NCAA Division III playoff berths. He shared Iowa Conference coach of the year honors in 2003.

Brand, a 2004 Central graduate, was a four-year volleyball letterwinner for the Dutch. The Davenport, Iowa native was a three-time NCAA Division III tournament participant, and a member of Central's 2000 national championship squad. Brand was a first-team All-Iowa Conference and All-AVCA Division III Central Region selection in 2003 and was twice named the Iowa Conference female athlete of the week. A team co-captain and MVP, Brand closed her career ranking fourth on Central's career kills charts (1,224) and sixth in career blocks (350).

Outlook

For the second straight year, the Central College volleyball team is faced with replacing an Iowa Conference MVP at middle hitter.

Coach Kent Clayberg hopes the Dutch answer the challenge as well as last year's club. Central captured a record 10th consecutive league title and its 15th overall, posting a 26-10 record and earning the program's 10th NCAA Division III tourney berth.

Four of last year's six starters are back with the starting libero returning as well as the Dutch look to build on a tradition which has seen them appear in 100 consecutive AVCA Division III top-25 rankings, a streak which began in 1997.

"These players are very smart, very athletic, very competitive and very committed to Central volleyball," Clayberg said. "It should be a fun team to coach."

Middle hitter

Filling the middle hitter position will be a preseason focus.

After losing Iowa Conference MVP Jamie Stark to graduation after the 2004 season, fellow middle hitter Katie Pederson followed with league MVP honors of her own. Meanwhile Katie Johnson earned first-team all-conference honors as she took over Stark's spot. Johnson, a 6-foot-1 junior, averaged 2.25 kills and 0.85 blocks while posting a team-high .305 attack percentage.

Clayberg expects Johnson to become an even more dominant player this fall, but acknowledges the importance of securing the other middle hitter position.

"I feel confident in Garra Williams and Megan Hansen," Clayberg said. "They are two players who have developed in the program for a couple of years and gained varsity experience last fall. They're strong, athletic and have great potential. I'm confident those two will step up and give us another strong middle hitter offensive and defensive attack."

Williams and Hansen are both 6-0 juniors and should also get help from 5-11 sophomore Melanie Gorter.

Outside hitter

Central has a position to fill on the outside but has plenty of experience. Alicia Whisner, a 5-9 senior, opened the year as a starter but was sidelined by injury midway through the season. The three-time letterwinner and two-time team co-captain averaged 2.03 kills and 2.92 digs while hitting .118 in 20 matches last year. She recorded four statistical double-doubles.

Ali Ripperger, a 5-9 junior, took over for Whisner and averaged 2.05 kills with 1.0 digs and a .196 attack percentage.

"We've got some good options," Clayberg said. "The upside to the injury to Alicia is that it gave Ali the opportunity to step in and develop at the varsity level, so that essentially gives us two returning starters."

The Dutch can also go with 5-8 sophomore Miranda Kouba, who appeared in 33 matches as a freshman and averaged 3.23 digs. Other outside hitter possibilities include juniors Traci Dyer and Jennifer Menary and sophomore Abby Schwennen.

"We should be able to score a lot of different ways on the outside," Clayberg said.

Right-side hitter

First-team all-conference pick Tessa Prati, a 5-11 senior, returns on the right side. Prati, a team co-captain, averaged a team-high 2.55 kills with a .230 attack percentage, 1.77 digs and 0.59 blocks.

"With Tessa, the right side is a real position of strength," Clayberg said. "She's a very physical, smart player who can control the net with a strong block, but she has the hands and agility to set for us if we need her to. Offensively she really emerged over the last half of the year. The sky's the limit for her."

The Dutch lack right-side experience beyond Prati, but 5-9 junior Whitney Taylor has trained there while Williams and Hansen could slide over as well.

Setter

Clayberg calls the setter position the deepest on the team. Terri Berger, a 5-5 junior, was a second-team all-league choice and earned league player of the week honors. A team co-captain, she averaged 9.39 assists and displayed offensive aggressiveness by averaging 1.31 kills with a .263 attack percentage and a team-high 47 service aces (0.39 average). She also averaged 1.94 digs and notched five double-doubles.

"Terri's very aggressive, competitive and smart," Clayberg said. "She's a dynamic athlete."

But Clayberg also likes Taylor and 5-8 sophomore Megan Callahan.

"I would be very comfortable with any of the three running the offense," he said. "They're all very different types of setters but they're all strong leaders."

"Whitney (Taylor) has a longer frame and is athletic enough that we could use her as a hitter as well," Clayberg said. "She's developed her understanding of the game and her ability to break a defense down."

"Megan (Callahan) has played some right-back defense for us. She's very composed, very steady and can get into the flow of the game easily."

Defensive specialist

Maggie Nowicki, a 5-6 sophomore, is the returning starter at libero. She averaged 4.64 digs.

"Maggie took over the starting role the third week of the season," Clayberg said. "She provides great confidence and poise and is a tenacious defender."

Katherine Pugh, a 5-7 senior, is a two-time team co-captain and can provide defensive help as well. She averaged 3.10 digs with 0.47 service aces while appearing in 19 matches last year. Also back is 5-8 sophomore Brittany Van Hemert.

"All three are very competitive and like the challenge of digging strong hitters," Clayberg said. "They're all capable attackers from the back row as well."

The freshmen

The preseason roster is freshman-dominated, with 22 first-year players.

"It's a large class and it's a class that has great potential," Clayberg said. "The nice thing is they have very quickly assimilated themselves into what Central volleyball is all about. They are very at ease with what they're coming into and are excited about it. They'll make us better."

While it's not ideal to rely extensively on freshmen in varsity action, Clayberg said he won't be afraid to give them playing time if they prove capable.

"It's a class that will come in and challenge our returning players," he said. "The returners are going to have to fight for their spots, which is exactly what we hope for from our freshmen. Their job is to come in and get in the flow as quickly as possible and force us to make tough decisions."

The schedule

Central set a league record with 53 consecutive Iowa Conference match victories from 1996-2001 and is riding a 37-match string entering 2006 but Clayberg expects a fiercely competitive league.

Wartburg, Simpson and Coe joined the Dutch in the league tourney semifinals last year and appear to be top contenders this season.

"Wartburg returns almost everyone," Clayberg said. "Simpson has a very senior-dominated, experienced team and Coe has one of the most athletic teams in the conference. Cornell was young last year but is very well-coached and will contend as well."

The Central schedule remains one of the region's toughest. Central plays in tournaments at perennial powers Washington (Mo.) and Trinity (Texas), with additional strong tourney action at Wis.-Eau Claire and Millikin. The Dutch play host to national contender Wis.-Whitewater in the Central Classic Sept. 22-23 and compete against the top teams in Minnesota at the IIAC-MIAC Border Battle in St. Paul.

The trip to San Antonio, Texas for the Trinity tournament Sept. 29-30 highlights the Dutch schedule.

"We've had a nice series with Trinity and it will be fun to go back to San Antonio, especially with a couple of San Antonio players on our roster," Clayberg said.

Dyer and her sister, freshman right-side hitter Rhiannon Dyer, are graduates of John Marshall High School in San Antonio.

Despite Central's tradition of success, Clayberg has no worries about complacency from his squad, which was bumped from the NCAA Division III tourney last year in a five-game opening-round match at St. Thomas (Minn.).

"We're proud of what we've accomplished at the conference and national levels," he said. "But there's certainly a hunger in these players. They want more. They understand that it's hard to get to the national tournament and that once you get there, everybody's talented. It's just about finding a way to win."
