Founded in 1853, Central College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college of the Reformed Church in America. Located 40 miles southeast of Des Moines, Central offers its 1,750 students learning opportunities not only on the Pella campus, but on branch campuses in London and Colchester, England; Merida, Yucatan, Mexico; Leiden, the Netherlands; and Carmarthen, Wales; and at study centers in Granada, Spain; Paris, France; and Vienna, Austria.

Central is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III, and the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Men compete in baseball, football, basketball, tennis, golf, wrestling, soccer, track and cross country while women compete in tennis, golf, track, softball, volleyball, cross country, soccer and basketball. Rugby is offered at the club level.

The Kuyper Athletics Complex

The Kuyper Athletics Complex is located at the corner of Independence Street and West Fifth Street in southwest Pella. The complex includes P.H. Kuyper Gymnasium (1970), H.S. Kuyper Fieldhouse (1987), A.N. Kuyper Field (1977), the baseball and softball fields (1978), Ryerson Golf Driving Range (2002), tennis courts (1992), soccer field (2005) and the Ron Schipper Fitness Center (1999). The complex also includes practice and intramural softball diamonds and football fields. Golf meets are held at the Bos Landen Golf Resort, two miles southwest of the campus on Highway T-15.

Garry Laidlaw

Head Coach

Garry Laidlaw is in his ninth year as head men's soccer coach at Central.

Inheriting a program that had never previously approached the .500 mark, Laidlaw engineered a turnaround which has produced a 54-18-3 (.740) mark over the past four years. His career mark is 71-68-7. Laidlaw was tabbed as the Iowa Conference coach of the year in 2002, after guiding his team to a 16-0-1 regular season. The Dutch were 15-3-1 in 2005 and tied for second place in the league at 6-1-1.

Previously Laidlaw served as head boys' soccer coach at Central High School in Champaign, Ill. for five seasons and also piloted the girls' squad for one year. He was named Illinois sectional coach of the year in 1995.

Born in England, Laidlaw grew up playing soccer in South Africa and Canada. He received his bachelor's degree from Eastern Illinois University where he was a three-time all-conference player and team captain. He was also a two-time all-region pick and was named the Mid-Continent Conference player of the year. Laidlaw later earned a tryout with the Wichita Wings of the Major Indoor Soccer League.

Laidlaw received a master's degree in physical education from Eastern Illinois in 1991. He taught physical education at St. Mathew's School in Champaign, Ill. for six years. At Central, he also serves as an academic counselor and exercise science instructor.

Outlook

See how far they've come.

When coach Garry Laidlaw met his first Central College men's soccer team in 1998, there weren't even enough players to hold a scrimmage and barely enough to stage a practice. The Dutch hadn't even come within three games of the .500 mark and his undermanned squad struggled to a 3-14-1 record in his first season.

But Central has posted a 54-18-2 mark over the past four seasons. The Dutch preseason roster numbers more than 40 players and includes nine returning starters from a 15-3-1 campaign that nearly landed the program's first NCAA Division III tournament berth and finished just a half game out of first place in the Iowa Conference.

The only thing separating Central from a first-ever conference title and NCAA trip are a few favorable kicks, Laidlaw said.

"We're good enough, but there are probably at least three teams in the conference that are good enough," he said. "It comes down to doing it on the day you play the game. We need a little luck. A bounce of the ball here or there could make the difference. The teams are dead even, but we maybe need that one shot that hit the bar last year to go in."

Forwards

The Dutch have plenty of players who could be the one to put that shot in the net. Central's top seven scorers return, led by first-team all-West Region forward Cody Stoermer, now a junior. He set school season records for assists (10) and shots (60) while scoring 13 goals. Sophomore forward Clint Schreiber notched eight goals, including a spectacular one off a midfield kickoff that landed on ESPN's "SportsCenter."

"You know what you're going to get every time out with both of those guys," Laidlaw said.

Senior Nate Bill is also a returning starter up front. He had four goals and an assist.

A transfer from Hampden-Sydney (Va.), junior Jamie Johnson of Marion, could force his way into the picture.

"He's a big, strong player who makes a good target," Laidlaw said.

First-team all-stater Ryan Rink of Cedar Falls and all-star game participant Chris Heffling of Johnston are freshman scoring threats.

"Chris (Heffling) was an attacking midfielder in high school," Laidlaw said. "We may explore using him as an outside midfielder or even up front because he can score goals. He's a good passer with good vision.

"Ryan (Rink) is extremely quick and has a great shot. He's very shifty and can pose problems for teams."

Laidlaw also expects to call on veterans Toby Neal and Brett Anderson, both seniors, and junior Tyman Wiley, either up front or in the midfield.

"They're going to push," Laidlaw said. "I'm hoping they continue to improve and also help lead the team."

Pushing as well will be freshman Matt Westfall of St. Joseph, Mo.

Midfielders

The Dutch are even more well-stocked in the midfield. Sophomore Cruz Herr and junior Blake Scott were both second-team all-conference picks last season while sophomore Jeff Adamczyk is also back.

"This is the most depth we've ever had in the midfield," Laidlaw said.

Central gets an additional boost with the return of senior Eric McDonald, who can play midfield or forward. He scored six goals in 2004 but missed nearly all of 2005 with a broken leg.

"I think the injury helped him in a way," Laidlaw said. "He learned to appreciate having the ability to go out there and play. If he's fully recovered-and that's the big question-he's definitely got the talent to help us."

Other possibilities include senior Ryan Petersen, sophomore Ben Heithoff, who could also play in the back, and sophomores Chris Purdue and Reid Petersen.

"Ben (Heithoff) is good enough to find some time," Laidlaw said. "Chris (Purdue) has worked very hard in the off-season. Technically and tactically, he's already there. He could challenge. And Reid (Petersen) has played both midfield and forward and will push hard for increased playing time."

On the outside, the Dutch return sophomore Cruz Herr, who had three goals and an assist, junior Blake Scott who notched three goals with four assists, and sophomore Jeff Adamczyk, who ranked third among Central's point-producers with three goals and five assists.

"Cruz (Herr) had a fantastic freshman year," Laidlaw said. "He's just so solid back there and is a great tackler. He's got a super engine and can run all day.

"Blake (Scott) is so consistent and reliable. He's a good passer and is very good in the air.

"We may play Jeff (Adamczyk) at forward. He's another versatile player who can run all day. He's quick, shifty and can score goals."

Laidlaw is also looking at freshmen Nathan Dorpinghaus of Albia, Ben Lewis of Fort Madison, Kyle Pekovitch of Lake Zurich, Ill., Drew Voorhees of Washington, Ill. and Jeremy Grider of Cedar Falls.

"They're all similar players," he said. "They're quick and can get up and down the touchline to offer support and serve the ball.

"How much they play depends on how quickly they adjust. But we've finally reached the point where we don't have to rely so heavily on freshmen. Even though we lost a lot of quality from last year's team, I feel pretty good about the core we have coming back."

Backs

The key to the season is rebuilding the defense. Central graduated second-team back Conrad Vernon and outside defender Nick Mohwinkle, leaving senior Eric Bentzinger and junior Jason Winslow as the returning starters.

"That's an area we'll be looking at early in the preseason," Laidlaw said. "We definitely need to get it shored up. It might mean making a change of formation and looking at new systems of play. We'll determine all that in the preseason."

Bentzinger is well-prepared to serve as the defensive backbone.

"He's a steady force back there," Laidlaw said.

Winslow will likely remain in the back as well.

"Jason's very versatile," Laidlaw said. "We can leave him there or move him up. He's a very good attacking player but willing to sacrifice for the good of the team and play where we need him."

Sophomore Scott Erie could also help after seeing time at forward last year.

"Scott has a lot to offer," Laidlaw said. "But he had an injury and was never able to get back in the lineup. He's had off-season surgery which hopefully corrects the problem because he's one of the most talented players on the team."

Sophomore Ben Heithoff could move back from the midfield.

"He can play almost any position on the team," Laidlaw said. "He did play a little in back last year. I think Ben is ready to come in and compete."

Freshman candidates include Erik Lundgren of Long Grove, Ill., Jaime Romero of Oswego, Ill., Matt Johnson of Albia, Andrew Messer of Norwalk, Brian O'Malley of Peoria, Ill. and Dustin Delvaux of Altoona.

The nice part is the Dutch have options.

"One thing we have is depth," he said. "The challenges for positions will be greater than ever. It will create a healthy, competitive atmosphere in our training."

Goalkeepers

Sophomore Greg Foote won the goalkeeper job as a rookie, making 14 starts and allowing 1.05 goals per game while posting a 12-2-1 record with 77 saves and three shutouts. He'll be pushed by junior Trent Payne, who had seven saves in six games, as well as junior college transfer Adam Chrestman of Rochelle, Ill.

"Greg (Foote) is coming off a solid freshman year as he was able to win and hold the starting position," Laidlaw said.

"But Trent (Payne) will challenge and we're excited about Adam (Chrestman). I think he will come in and challenge as well. It's the most depth we've had."

But Laidlaw would prefer to not share the goalkeeping duties.

"I'd prefer to have someone win it outright," he said. "But if we need the non-conference season to find that out, we'll do that and then go with one for the conference matches."

The road ahead

Laidlaw calls Wartburg and Loras the teams to beat in the Iowa Conference, with Simpson and Luther in the mix as well. But the league's increasing strength could prove beneficial when NCAA tourney bids are awarded.

"The fact that two teams from our league reached the final 16 last year really helps," Laidlaw said. "It shows our conference is getting respect and deservedly so. With the expanded field this year, there's a good possibility of getting two teams from the Iowa Conference in again."

A strong non-conference showing is needed as well and the Dutch have beefed up the schedule, taking on seven schools from the highly regarded Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, playing six on the road.

"We feel we're playing some of the strongest teams the region offers," Laidlaw said. "What that will do is help us become hardened to playing tough competition and help prepare us for the conference. We want to have a schedule where every game we play is competitive so that we're consistently playing at the highest level."

The Dutch program is in position to attain new heights.

"The returning players are coming off the success we had last year and the hunger for more is there," Laidlaw said.

"The work they've been putting in during the off-season is there. Everything is in place, we've just got to do it on the day we play."
