Founded in 1853, Central College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college of the Reformed Church in America. Located 40 miles southeast of Des Moines, Central offers its 1,750 students learning opportunities not only on the Pella campus, but on branch campuses in London and Colchester, England; Merida, Yucatan, Mexico; Leiden, the Netherlands; and Carmarthen, Wales; and at study centers in Granada, Spain; Paris, France; and Vienna, Austria.

Central is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III, and the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Men compete in baseball, football, basketball, tennis, golf, wrestling, soccer, track and cross country while women compete in tennis, golf, track, softball, volleyball, cross country, soccer and basketball. Rugby is offered at the club level.

The Kuyper Athletics Complex

The Kuyper Athletics Complex is located at the corner of Independence Street and West Fifth Street in southwest Pella. The complex includes P.H. Kuyper Gymnasium (1970), H.S. Kuyper Fieldhouse (1987), A.N. Kuyper Field (1977), the baseball and softball fields (1978), Ryerson Golf Driving Range (2002), tennis courts (1992), soccer field (2005) and the Ron Schipper Fitness Center (1999). The complex also includes practice and intramural softball diamonds and football fields. Golf meets are held at the Bos Landen Golf Resort, two miles southwest of the campus on Highway T-15.

Rick Burns

Head coach

Soccer coaching veteran Rick Burns is entering his third year as head women's soccer coach at Central College.

In his first season at Central in 2004, Burns piloted a small, inexperienced squad to a surprising 8-8-1 record and an Iowa Conference tournament berth. It was the 20th time in his 23 seasons as a collegiate head coach that his squad posted a .500 record or better. The 2005 squad jumped to a 7-1 start but lost four starters to injury and closed at 7-11, giving Burns a 15-19-1 Central record and a 267-168-24 career mark (.607).

Burns was previously the head women's soccer coach for five years at Gordon College (Mass.). He has coaching experience at all NCAA division levels. He spent five years at Div. I Drury University (Mo.), was head women's coach at Mount Holyoke College (Mass.) for six seasons and was the men's head soccer coach at Mercyhurst College (Pa.) and St. Mary's University (Minn.) for three seasons each.

Burns is a five-time conference coach of the year and has coached 20 teams with cumulative grade point averages of 3.0 or better.

A devout student of coaching philosophy, Burns has authored some 40 articles in soccer and coaching publications.

Burns is a graduate of Northwest Nazarene University (Idaho) and earned a master's degree at California State University, Los Angeles.

Kathryn Burns is in her third season as assistant women's soccer coach at Central College.

Burns served at an assistant coach for three seasons at Mercyhurst College (Pa.) and was a volunteer assistant coach for several seasons with husband Rick's teams.

Outlook

The Central College women's soccer team is eyeing a return to the Iowa Conference tournament after a year's absence.

Following a promising 7-1 non-conference start, injuries and an offensive drought proved costly in league play last season and the Dutch closed at 7-11.

Eight starters return, including two-time all-Iowa Conference goalkeeper Ashley Veigelt, back for her senior year. Nine of Central's losses last year were by two goals or less, fueling thoughts of a possible turnaround.

"Last year we lost a lot of games 1-0 and 2-1 against the teams we were competing with for the tournament," coach Rick Burns said. "If we can beat three of those teams, we could squeeze into that last spot. That would be a big step for us."

A lack of depth was a liability last year and remains a concern.

"We only played 11-13 players," Burns said. "If players are going to go a full 90 minutes, you have to balance being fit and being fresh, which means limiting training. It's a fine line. You have to be in shape but you have to have fresh legs."

However Burns said the Dutch rotation could go a bit deeper this year, which would likely produce favorable results.

"The infusion of a couple strong transfers and a few touted freshmen in addition to the eight returning starters gives me great hope," Burns said.

Forwards

A big chunk of the scoring load fell on the shoulders of junior Tori Rittman and fortunately, she's talented enough to handle it. Rittman scored 11 goals with five assists, the sixth-highest season goals total in the program's history. Her running mate up front is sophomore Stephanie Ellwanger, who had three goals and two assists.

"Tori (Rittman) is a very good player," Burns said. "I'm hoping that with some other people we can bring some of the pressure off of her."

Burns is even toying with moving Rittman back slightly and pushing Ellwanger up to alleviate that pressure.

"Steph (Ellwanger) is a tough, physical player who holds the ball well," Burns said. "We may move her up to a point forward position."

Midfield

Burns thinks the Dutch midfield will be stronger. Sophomore Sarah Frese and junior Rose Feldman have some experience there and Burns thinks the Dutch have picked up some additional speed with freshmen Kelli Hancock of Cedar Falls, Jenna Hindman of Swisher and Jessica Steward of Cedar Falls. Hancock is especially likely to make a quick impact, Burns

said.

Backs

The Dutch defense remains the team's strength. Senior Megan Augustin and sophomores Erin Sheehan and Amy Van Der Kamp return. Feldman also has experience in the back.

"They are wily and seasoned veterans who are full of enthusiasm," Burns said. "We'll have a good, strong, experienced back four."

Sheehan, who could also be used in the midfield, "will be one of our stronger players," Burns said.

Van Der Kamp showed great promise in her rookie year, but had the season cut short by injury in the seventh game.

Goalkeeper

Central is deepest in goal. Veigelt made 133 saves in 18 games, posting a 1.49 goals-allowed average with five shutouts.

She is backed by junior Michelle Gilbert, a highly regarded transfer from Southwest State (Minn.) who played high school soccer at Valley in West Des Moines. However Burns said it's not likely Gilbert will be idle as she can probably be used in the field.

Central also has a solid freshman goalkeeper in Abby Marshall of Newton.

The league

Defending champ Loras retains the Iowa Conference favorite's tag, Burns said, with pressure coming from Wartburg. He views Cornell, Coe, Buena Vista and Central as the chief contenders for the sixth league playoff position.

Burns relied on Central's defensive strength last year in his tactics but hopes to utilize some selective offensive aggressiveness in 2006.

"Against the top teams we'll still have to sit back, defend and rely on the counterattack," he said. "But against two-thirds of the teams on the schedule, I think we can play more even up."

Burns likes his team's intangibles, particularly the guidance provided by his seniors, Augustin and Veigelt.

"Megan and Ashley are both enthusiastic," Burns said. "They're very loyal and have hung in there for four years. They will give us strong leadership on and off the field as we cycle through the inevitable phases of the season."

And Burns will continue to chart his players' progress through measures other than the scoreboard.

"My goal is that they play with strong spirits and kind hearts," he said. "I hope that they will train and play with vigor, enjoy the experience and have the grace to accept whatever happens. My star burns bright with anticipation of the upcoming season."
