Founded in 1853, Central College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college of the Reformed Church in America. Located 40 miles southeast of Des Moines, Central offers its 1,750 students learning opportunities not only on the Pella campus, but on branch campuses in London and Colchester, England; Merida, Yucatan, Mexico; Leiden, the Netherlands; and Carmarthen, Wales; and at study centers in Granada, Spain; Paris, France; and Vienna, Austria.

Central is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III, and the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Men compete in baseball, football, basketball, tennis, golf, wrestling, soccer, track and cross country while women compete in tennis, golf, track, softball, volleyball, cross country, soccer and basketball. Rugby is offered at the club level.

The Kuyper Athletics Complex

The Kuyper Athletics Complex is located at the corner of Independence Street and West Fifth Street in southwest Pella. The complex includes P.H. Kuyper Gymnasium (1970), H.S. Kuyper Fieldhouse (1987), A.N. Kuyper Field (1977), the baseball and softball fields (1978), Ryerson Golf Driving Range (2002), tennis courts (1992), soccer field (2005) and the Ron Schipper Fitness Center (1999). The complex also includes practice and intramural softball diamonds and football fields. Golf meets are held at the Bos Landen Golf Resort, two miles southwest of the campus on Highway T-15.

Charlie Estabrook

Head coach

Charlie Estabrook is in his ninth season as head of Central's nationally competitive men's golf program.

He's guided the Dutch to five Iowa Conference championships (1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2003) and is a four-time league coach of the year pick (1998, 2001, 2002, 2003). Central has captured 25 league men's golf titles overall, including

21 in the past 24 seasons.

Estabrook has also piloted Central to NCAA Division III championship appearances the past five seasons (2001, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005), placing in the national top 10 twice.

Estabrook, a native of Davenport, is a long-time private golf instructor. For three seasons he also served as head boys' baseball coach at Pella Christian High School and is entering his third summer as the Pella High School girls' softball coach. Estabrook is the manager of grounds/facility at Central and supervises maintenance of the college's new Ryerson Golf Practice Range.

Tom Linton

Assistant coach

Tom Linton is in his fifth season as assistant men's golf coach.

Linton is a native of Minneapolis, Minn. where he helped Central High School win the city golf crown. He received his bachelor's degree from St. Olaf College and his masters and doctoral degrees from the University of Wisconsin.

Linton serves as assistant professor of mathematics and computer science at Central.

Clint Brown

Assistant coach

Clint Brown is in his third season as assistant men's golf coach at Central.

A 2003 Central graduate and a graduate of Wapello High School, Brown is a former golf team member for the Dutch and served as a student assistant coach in 2002-03.

Outlook

Don't misunderstand. Coach Charlie Estabrook is delighted that his Central College men's golf team has gained a berth in the NCAA Division III Championships the past five years, further enriching a tradition that has produced 26 NCAA trips since 1976.

Estabrook very much wants the Dutch—who ended the fall season in a tie for 21st in the national Division III coaches' poll—to again experience the burst of euphoria that comes when the next NCAA field is announced in May.

But there's been a void in the last two seasons and it's perched atop the 2006 team's priority list in bold letters. After winning 24 Iowa Conference championships in 28 years, the Dutch came up short in the 2004 and 2005 league tournaments. And last year's squad, after making a late run, dipped to third in the conference for the first time since 1979.

The strength of Central's overall results from the fall and spring campaigns carried the Dutch into the national tourney, but a sense of incompleteness lingered. It would be too harsh to compare the season satisfaction level to a fast-food take-out meal, but it certainly wasn't the full buffet.

The players are keenly aware of this year's priorities. But just in case, Estabrook is reminding them, seemingly with each swing on the new campus Ryerson Practice Range.

"I've put the word out that I don't even want to hear the word 'nationals' until May," Estabrook said. "At every meeting and every practice, my focus is talking about the things that are important this season before we worry about the results at the end."

The lineup

An untested lineup might appear to make regaining the league crown a more elusive challenge for this year's squad than the one that placed third in 2005. Four-time NCAA tourney veterans Nick Grossman and Jake Pearson, both all-conference performers last year, have graduated.

"We're young and inexperienced and that really showed last fall," Estabrook said, noting the Dutch often went with a lineup of two juniors, two sophomores and a freshman.

Yet Estabrook likes the promise he's seeing flashes of as the Dutch prepare for the spring campaign.

Junior Brett Meyer, who also gained all-league recognition after finishing ninth in the conference meet, is among the early picks to take over the team's No. 1 position. Last fall he took first place at the Ryerson Fall Classic and was also Central's top golfer at the Nebraska Wesleyan Fall Invitational. He posted a 76.8 fall stroke average.

"I think Brett's even better than he showed last fall," Estabrook said.

Junior Cole Reiman emerged as a varsity contender in the fall, forcing his way into the lineup with some low numbers for Central's second unit, the White team. Then in his varsity debut, the 18-team Twin Cities Classic--a 54-hole event filled with the top Division III teams in the Midwest--Reiman walked away with medalist honors, firing 74-73-73-220 on three demanding Minneapolis-area tracks.

"We always knew Cole was a good player," Estabrook said. "He finally stepped up and showed how good he could be. We saw a brand-new Cole. Hopefully he steps up and helps lead the team. If he keeps on the same path, he'll have a great year."

The Dutch also return two other players who joined Meyer on the varsity squad last spring, senior Andrew Kinney and junior Alvaro De Cosio. Kinney had an up-and-down fall but was the team medalist at the BluGold Collegiate Tournament at Eau Claire, Wis. in September.

"Andrew's our lone senior," Estabrook said. "He felt he had a disappointing fall, but he works as hard as anybody. I really hope he comes out and has a great spring season so he can go out with a bang."

De Cosio struggled with his swing mechanics last spring and spent most of the fall on the White team, but did take team medalist honors in the final autumn meet at Grand View.

"There's nobody on the team who's hit more balls than Alvaro and there's nobody who wants it more than Alvaro," Estabrook said. "I think he's going to come out strong this spring."

Juniors Isaac Rodenberg and Derek Deminsky are also pushing their way onto the scene. Rodenberg made rapid progress last spring and nearly won the team's final lineup spot for the NCAA tournament. Deminsky has also improved and was Central's No. 2 finisher in three varsity tournaments last fall.

"Isaac's been hitting the weights and running quite a bit during the winter," Estabrook said. "I'm hoping that his dedication and hard work pays off for him."

"I think Derek will continue to get better," he said. "He's getting stronger through weight training and his ball striking now is as good as it's ever been. His short game is the best on the team, so if his ball-striking keeps improving, he'll definitely be a player for us."

Also eyeing improved showings are sophomore Reid Turner and junior Josh Noonan.

"Reid's been working extremely hard," Estabrook said. "I think he's going to step up and get things done for us."

"Josh has done nothing but improve every year he's been here. He just needs to play one shot at a time and not think about his score. He's a great leader for us."

Among the newcomers, freshman Andy Peterson of Davenport showed glimpses of future dominance.

"He's got the potential to shoot incredibly low scores," Estabrook said. "He just needs to learn to let it happen. He's got a good work ethic, a great attitude and hits the ball a mile."

Freshman Scott Swainston saw action with Central's Red team in four fall meets and is also a potential contributor.

Estabrook isn't worried about having a clear-cut No. 1 player.

"I've really pushed the guys to understand that if we have five good scores, you don't have to have a No. 1 go out and shoot a great score," he said. "It takes the pressure off."

Championship hopes

Estabrook calls a veteran Wartburg squad the team to beat. The Knights placed second in the league last year. Estabrook expects Luther to make a charge as well.

"Luther's very talented but they're also extremely young," he said. "As they keep getting experience, they'll keep getting better."

A return trip to the NCAA tourney isn't a sure thing, either. The Dutch finished the fall campaign rated fifth in the region and Estabrook said it's possible that only four region teams will be selected for the championship meet at Lincoln, Neb. May 8-11.

"We definitely have to play better," Estabrook said. "But I know we can."
