Founded in 1853, Central College is a four-year coeducational liberal arts college of the Reformed Church in America. Located 40 miles southeast of Des Moines, Central offers its 1,750 students learning opportunities not only on the Pella campus, but on branch campuses in London and Colchester, England; Merida, Yucatan, Mexico; Leiden, the Netherlands; and Carmarthen, Wales; and at study centers in Granada, Spain; Paris, France; and Vienna, Austria.

Central is a member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, Division III, and the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. Men compete in baseball, football, basketball, tennis, golf, wrestling, soccer, track and cross country while women compete in tennis, golf, track, softball, volleyball, cross country, soccer and basketball. Rugby is offered at the club level.

The Kuyper Athletics Complex

The Kuyper Athletics Complex is located at the corner of Independence Street and West Fifth Street in southwest Pella. The complex includes P.H. Kuyper Gymnasium (1970), H.S. Kuyper Fieldhouse (1987), A.N. Kuyper Field (1977), the baseball and softball fields (1978), Ryerson Golf Driving Range (2002), tennis courts (1992), soccer field (2005) and the Ron Schipper Fitness Center (1999). The complex also includes practice and intramural softball diamonds and football fields. Golf meets are held at the Bos Landen Golf Resort, two miles southwest of the campus on Highway T-15.

Doug Stursma

Head coach

Doug Stursma is in his 13th season as head men's and women's tennis coach at Central, where he has posted a 96-70 dual record in women's matches and a 163-85 men's mark for a combined 259-155 (.625). He was named the Iowa Conference men's coach of the year in 1996, 1999 and 2000, after piloting the Dutch to league championships in those seasons. He earned league coaching honors in women's tennis in 1994 and 2003.

A Pella native, Stursma is a top amateur player. He has been in the Iowa Tennis Association rankings since 1980 and is currently ranked in the men's open division. In 2004, he placed 17th in the National 50s Hardcourt Championships in Santa Barbara, Calif.

For eight seasons Stursma was the boys' tennis coach at Pella Christian High School, guiding the Eagles to the Class 1A state championship in 1994 while finishing second in 1995 and third in 1993.

Tait Smock

Assistant coach

Tait Smock is in his first season as assistant men's tennis coach.

A 2002 Central graduate from Decorah, Smock was a four-year men's tennis letterwinner, 2002 team MVP and a team captain for the Dutch.

Smock racked up a 60-27 career singles record, including a 16-1 mark in 1999, while posting a 59-23 doubles mark. He helped Central win a pair of Iowa Conference team championships and a four-year dual meet record of 62-22.

Outlook

Successful teams often win with seniors. Coach Doug Stursma hopes that's the case for his Central College men's tennis team.

While there are some significant gaps in the lineup that produced a 21-8 record a year ago, Stursma anticipates most being plugged by veteran players. As many as five seniors could see action at the six varsity positions.

NOTE: Iowa Conference individual tournament format was changed in 1998, reducing singles flights from six to three and doubles flights from three to two. Also, schools are no longer limited to entering one player per flight.

The Dutch start the year with three open singles spots. But there's no uncertainty at the top. Senior Nick Cochrane looks to cap his rock-solid Central career with his best showing at the Iowa Conference tournament and will likely shatter the school's career singles' victories record as well. At 53-23, he's just four shy of Aaron Enderlin's record of 57 wins. He enters 2006 tied for fifth place on the list, which includes players from the past 20 seasons.

A three-time all-conference honoree and an academic standout as well, Cochrane took second place in the league's A flight singles last spring, with Coe's Ryan Yao taking the title. Yao returns this season and will be a heavy favorite to retain the crown, but Stursma said Cochrane isn't likely to surrender easily.

"Knowing Nick, he probably has a goal of winning the conference championship as a team and an individual," Stursma smiled. "And I guess you don't want to ever put anything past Nick. He's a tremendous worker and always gives it his all, whether it's in practice or in a meet. By the end of the year, I expect him to be even stronger than he was last year, simply because of his work ethic. He's an ideal role model for the other players."

However the Dutch graduated last year's No. 2 and 3 singles' players, CoSIDA Academic All-American Jason Ford and Aaron Enderlin, respectively. Andrew Busscher, who played at No. 6 singles, is gone as well. That forces the No. 4 and 5 players, sophomore Jared Fedderson and senior Ryan Dierks to jump two spots higher in the lineup. Fedderson was 18-8 last season while Dierks was 11-10.

"The players who we lost have left a pretty big hole," Stursma said. "But we do have quite a few seniors and I think we can be a pretty solid team yet."

Stursma sees six players battling for the remaining three spots, with the early advantage going to senior Kris Walters, sophomore Chris Bliss and senior David Brondyke. But junior Devin Bates, senior Ryan Ooms and sophomore Nick Rohner will be among those also getting looks.

"Walters and Brondyke are both seniors and have some experience," Stursma said. "I think they can come along well."

"Bliss is only a sophomore, but showed some good tennis in practice and in meets last fall. (Playing varsity) might be tough for him at the beginning but I think will make progress as the season goes along."

Cochrane and Dierks each were part of all-conference doubles teams last year, although Stursma didn't enter the season with any set doubles combinations in mind and typically does considerable experimenting before making decisions.

There are few pushovers in the non-conference schedule. Division I Western Illinois, spring break opponent Mesa State (Colo.) and April 1 triangular foes Carleton (Minn.) and Wis.-Eau Claire offer some of the most intriguing matchups for the Dutch.

Within the Iowa Conference, defending champion Coe College has a powerful lineup again, but could face a stiff challenge from Luther College, Stursma said. Central will likely have to scrap again to retain third place.

"Coe and Luther are loaded," Stursma said. "We would have to improve significantly from where we're at to push either of them."

Stursma said he doesn't yet know enough about the rest of the league teams to determine how the Dutch stack up.

"I think we have a good shot at third," he said. "Cornell may be the team that pushes us the most, but I don't know what everyone else has."

Yet Stursma said the Dutch are capable of pulling a few surprises.

"We've got to work as hard in practice every night as they do the first night," he said. "It's easy to let up after a while. But if the players continue to work that way and I can motivate them to do such, then good things can happen."
